Author revisions from the Reviewer's Comments:

1. The insights are important to consider improving the education quality in Indonesia.

Some statements have been included to present the ideas to improve the education quality in Indonesia (in the discussion part)

2. There is some incongruence between the title and the contents. The title is about Indonesia but the research site is only Dompu, NTB. It needs to be stated in the Research Method, with some argument underlying the choice of that site. Otherwise, readers might misunderstand, thinking that the education system in Dompu represents that in the whole country, Indonesia.

Some arguments have been added to address the rational of selecting the research site (in the method part)

3. It is important that niche is explicitly stated in the introduction because it determines the importance of conducting this research.

The niche has been inserted to make it clear about the research site (in the introduction part)

4. Data were collected by observation, library, and documentation study. But, some important points are not included, such as data sources: site & subjects, Data collection is not detailed, e.g. how the observation was done and what documents were studied are not clarified. Data analysis does not exist in the method. A good method is one that enables other researchers to replicate.

Information about data, sources of data, and site/subjects have been inserted accordingly (in the method part)

5. Some claims were made normatively, which is always true though not sufficiently supported by data.

Several data to support the findings have been stated accordingly (in the discussion part)

6. Comparing a cat with a lion is unfair unless their similarities are addressed.

The present study does not really compare between Indonesian and Finland's education system, but to take a look at Finland as a role model only. Moreover, learn from what Finland has been done on its great educational achievement. I have adjusted the statements relating to this matters.

7. Some references have not been cited in the article text.

The references have been adjusted accordingly

8. Conclusion: Accepted with some revision.
